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## **Introduction**

AIIMS Bilaspur, located in Himachal Pradesh, is a premier medical institution set up by the Government of India through the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY). The institute has been created to strengthen advanced healthcare services in regions that previously lacked access to high-quality tertiary medical facilities. As part of the national vision to expand medical education and enhance the availability of trained healthcare professionals, AIIMS Bilaspur functions on the framework established by the Act of Parliament for the new AIIMS institutions, modeled after AIIMS New Delhi. The institute integrates patient care, medical teaching, and research, offering modern training in various disciplines of medicine, nursing, and allied health sciences. AIIMS Bilaspur offers academic programmes including MBBS, MD, MS, DM, M.Ch., M.Sc. Nursing, B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing and other academic courses approved by the respective statutory bodies. Medical programmes are recognized by the National Medical Commission (NMC), while Nursing programmes are governed by the Indian Nursing Council (INC). The institute aims to emerge as a centre of excellence that contributes to improved healthcare outcomes in the Himalayan region and beyond.

## **Aims & Objectives**

The Post Basic Diploma Courses in Nursing at AIIMS Bilaspur aim to prepare competent, skilled, and professionally sound nurses with specialized knowledge and advanced clinical skills in their respective areas of nursing practice. The programs are designed to strengthen the clinical capabilities of registered nurses and enable them to deliver high-quality, evidence-based nursing care in specialized and complex healthcare settings.

The objectives of the Post Basic Diploma Courses in Nursing are to:

1. Develop an in-depth understanding of nursing principles, standards, and practices relevant to specialized nursing care.
2. Enable nurses to apply evidence-based practices in the prevention, management, and rehabilitation of patients with complex health problems.
3. Strengthen critical thinking, clinical judgment, and decision-making skills required in emergency, specialty, and high-dependency care settings.
4. Promote effective communication, leadership, and teamwork skills for functioning efficiently within multidisciplinary healthcare teams.
5. Foster ethical practice, professional responsibility, and accountability in nursing care delivery.

## Post Basic Diploma Courses in Nursing

**Duration of the course: One Year**

**Medium of Instruction: English**

**Objectives of the Course:** The Post Basic Diploma Courses in Nursing at AIIMS Bilaspur are designed to develop an understanding of philosophy, principles and standards of nursing care in the respective speciality areas. These courses aim to strengthen the clinical competence of registered nurses by providing in-depth theoretical knowledge and intensive supervised clinical experience in specialized areas of nursing practice.

At the end of the programme, the candidates will be able to:

- Apply advanced nursing principles, concepts, and evidence-based practices in the respective specialty areas.
- Provide comprehensive, safe, and high-quality nursing care to patients with complex health needs.
- Demonstrate critical thinking, clinical decision-making, and problem-solving skills in emergency and specialized care settings.
- Utilize leadership, communication, and teamwork skills effectively while working as part of the multidisciplinary healthcare team.
- Participate in health promotion, disease prevention, rehabilitation, and palliative care services relevant to the specialty.

### Eligibility Criteria

- Must be a registered nurse (R.N.& R.M.) or equivalent with any SNRC having NUID number.
- Possess a minimum of one-year clinical experience as a staff nurse.
- Possess Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery with one-year experience as Staff Nurse or B.Sc. Nursing or equivalent.
- The prescribed experience will be calculated only after obtaining the license from the state nursing council.
- Selection will be based on the merit obtained in entrance examination.

#### **Upper Age Limit–**

35 years (as of 31<sup>st</sup> July 2026), relaxable by 3 years for OBC candidates, 5 years for SC/ST candidates and Age relaxation for PwBD candidates shall be applicable as per Government of India norms.

**\*One seat (5% of the total intake of 25 seats) shall be reserved for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) on a horizontal basis.**

- If requisite number of suitable candidates is not available to fill up the seats reserved for the Scheduled Castes, the same will be filled by candidates belonging to the Scheduled Tribes and vice-versa
- In case suitable candidates are not available from the two reserved categories, the vacant seats will be filled up by the candidates from the general category
- In case suitable candidates are also not available in the OBC(NCL) reserved category, the same will be filled up by the candidates from the general category

- In case the EWS seats remain vacant after calling all eligible EWS seats shall be made available to the candidates who belong to General Category.
- In case seat is not available in any category (SC/ST/OBC(NCL)/EWS) and candidate of the same category apply for course they shall be treated as UR subject to fulfilment of eligibility of UR.

**Criteria For Other Backward Classes (Non-Creamy Layer) [Obc(Ncl)] And Economically Weaker Section (EWS)**

1. Candidates applying under OBC category must produce the valid caste certificate in the format provided by the DoP&T vide O.M. No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res.) dated 30.05.2014 and further clarification issued by DoP&T OM No. 36036/2/2013-Estt(Res-I) dated 31.03.2016. The certificate must mention the non-creamy layer status of the applicant (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93- Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993). The OBC applicants who belong to the 'Non- Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs (notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at the website <http://ncbc.nic.in>, shall be eligible to be considered for admission to Post Basic Diploma Courses in Nursing, July 2026 session under OBC category (Validity period of OBC Certificate in respect of non-creamy layer status of the applicants as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be issued for the financial year 2025-2026 (which is the year of advertisement) (considering income upto financial year ending on 31st Mar, 2025), issued from 1st April 2025 to 15th May 2025. If the applicant does not have the OBC non-creamy layer certificate valid for the financial year 2025-2026 at the time of registration, the applicant must upload the previously issued (older) OBC non-creamy layer certificate or the acknowledgment slip of the OBC non-creamy layer certificate application. However, at the time when asked to submit/upload the valid certificate, the applicant must produce the applicable certificate valid for financial year (2025-26) as said above. This additional certificate (if any) must have a reference of his / her already issued original caste certificate.
2. The vacancies advertised under EWS Category are as per the instructions issued by DoPT, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pension, Govt. of India, vide OM. No. 36039/1/2019-Estt (Res), dated 31.01.2019. Application under EWS category will be

considered subject to submission of Income and Assets certificate on a prescribed format issued by the competent authority and subject to verification of genuineness of the certificate by the issuing authority. In pursuance to DoP&T OM No. 36039/1/2019-Estt(Res), dated 31.01.2019, a EWS certificate issued in prescribed format for employment/Admission in Central Government Institution on the basis of income of financial year 2024-2025, issued from 1st April 2025 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2026 and valid for financial year 2025-2026 or on the basis of income of financial year 2025-2026, issued from 1st April 2026 to 24th April 2026 and valid for financial year 2026-2027.

3. Candidates who fail to produce valid category certificate OBC/EWS/SC/ST/PwBD etc. during document verification or as and when required to produce the same, the candidature will be cancelled. All candidates are advised to obtain required valid category certificate in advance to avoid cancellation of candidature at any stage of the recruitment process.
4. Candidates who have claimed the reservation category and fail to produce a valid category certificate as applicable as per published criteria the candidature shall be cancelled in the reserved category, and allocated seats shall be forfeited.
5. Reservation for PwBD will be as per the guidelines /Instruction contained in DoP&T OM No. 36035/02/2017-Estt (Res) dated 15.01.2018 with regard to reservation for persons with disabilities. Only such persons would be eligible for reservation under PwBD quota in service/posts who suffer from not less than 40% of physical disability. Person who wants to avail the benefit of reservation would have to submit a Disability Certificate as issued by a Competent Authority in prescribed format. However, the candidature of PwBD applicant is subject to evaluation by a Medical Board duly constituted by the Executive Director of respective AIIMS or by the respective institute. This Medical Board will evaluate suitability of candidates for the post he/she is being considered for. All the instructions of Govt. of India as amended and as applicable in this matter will be followed.

#### **Criteria For Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe (SC /ST)**

Reservation for SC/ST candidates will be according to the rules of Government of India. Applicants will be required to produce the necessary certificate in the format provided. During Seat Allocation the certificate as prescribed in M.H.A., O.M., No. 42/21/49-N.G.S. dated the 28.1.1952, as revised in Dept. of Per-& A.R. letter No. 36012/6/76-Est. (S.CT), dated the 29.10.1977, to be produced by candidate belonging to a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe in support of his/her claim.

### **Criteria For Persons With Benchmark Disability (PWBD)**

In accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, 5% seats of the annual sanctioned intake capacity shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities, based on the merit list of Entrance Examination. For this purpose, the Specified Disability contained in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 is annexed in **APPENDIX-II**. The candidate must possess a valid document certifying his/her physical disability. The disability certificate should be certified by a duly constituted and authorized Medical Board of the State or Central Govt. Hospitals / Institutions. All PWBD candidates shall be evaluated by a Medical Board of the Institute to determine eligibility.

### **Method of Selection**

- Selection will be made strictly on merit, based on the percentage of marks obtained in the Common Entrance Examination conducted by the Institute. Candidates should indicate their preferred choice of specialty in the application form. The final selection list will be prepared taking into consideration the final merit, preferences indicated by the candidates, and availability of seats.
- If any discrepancy in any question is found in Entrance Examination, candidate is advised to write to Dean (Examination), AIIMS, Bilaspur within 24 hours of completion of examination on following email: E-mail [office.dean.exam@aiimsbilaspur.edu.in](mailto:office.dean.exam@aiimsbilaspur.edu.in)
- **Written test carrying 100 marks of 120 minutes duration.**
- **The question paper shall consist of 100 Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) with a single correct response.**
- The Merit list will be drawn Category-wise. The results will be displayed on the website <https://www.aiimsbilaspur.edu.in/>. There will be no individual communication. Candidates are requested to regularly visit the official website.
- Candidate found medically fit by AIIMS Bilaspur Medical Board and subsequently admitted to the course will be required to pay the full fees.
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### **Minimum Cut-off Scores for Post Basic Diploma in Nursing Courses**

The minimum qualifying score in the competitive entrance examination shall be the 50th percentile for all candidates seeking admission to the Post Basic Diploma Courses in Nursing.

### **Method of seat allocation**

Seat Allocation for admission in Post Basic Diploma in Nursing shall be held in

#### **(a) First Round of Seat Allocation**

1. Seat allocation shall be carried out strictly on the basis of merit obtained in the Entrance Examination, category-wise eligibility, candidate preferences, and availability of seats.
2. Candidates securing the prescribed minimum qualifying percentile/marks shall be eligible to participate in the seat allocation process.
3. Seat allocation shall be undertaken in the order of categories: **UR, SC, ST, OBC (NCL), and EWS**, based on the merit list prepared by the Institute.

#### **(b) Subsequent/Final Round/Spot Seat Allocation**

1. In the event that seats remain vacant after the first round of counselling, a subsequent/final round of seat allocation may be conducted by the Institute.
2. All candidates fulfilling the minimum qualifying criteria prescribed for admission shall be eligible to participate in the final round, subject to availability of seats.
3. If a seat reserved for **Scheduled Caste (SC)** remains vacant after exhausting the eligible SC candidates, it may be offered to an eligible **Scheduled Tribe (ST)** candidate, and vice versa.
4. If any SC/ST seat remains vacant even after exhausting all eligible SC/ST candidates, such seat shall be converted to the **Unreserved (UR)** category and offered strictly on merit.
5. If any **OBC (NCL)** seat remains vacant after exhausting all eligible OBC (NCL) candidates, such seat shall be converted to the **Unreserved (UR)** category and filled on merit.
6. If any **EWS** seat remains vacant after exhausting all eligible EWS candidates, such seat shall be converted to the **Unreserved (UR)** category and filled on merit.

### **Centre for Competitive Entrance Examination**

The Examination will be conducted at AIIMS Bilaspur by the Examination Section of the Institute. Candidates are advised to check location of the test centre in advance to avoid any type of difficulty on the examination day.

### **Syllabus for entrance examination**

- All nursing curriculum subjects (as per the GNM and B.Sc. Nursing curriculum prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council).

### **Scheme of Marking**

- The Entrance Examination will be conducted in English medium only.

- Each correct response will carry one mark.
- No marks will be awarded for unanswered or incorrectly answered questions.
- In case of a tie in the entrance examination marks, ranking will be determined based on the percentage obtained in B.Sc. Nursing/GNM. If the tie persists, the candidate senior in age will be ranked higher. In the event of a further tie, the ranking will be decided by draw of lots.

### **Instructions for Candidates**

#### **(Please Read Carefully)**

1. Issue of Hall Ticket is provisional. If any ineligibility is detected at any stage, the candidature will be cancelled.
2. Once inside the Examination Centre premises, candidates will be under continuous surveillance and all activities will be monitored. Candidates are strictly advised not to indulge in any unlawful or unfair activities, failing which strict disciplinary and legal action will be taken.
3. Entry into the Examination Hall is strictly subject to the production of the Hall Ticket along with a valid original photo identity proof, such as Passport, Driving License, Bank Passbook with photograph, Aadhaar Card with photograph, or any other valid Government-issued photo identity card.
4. Mobile phones, iPads, calculators, wrist watches, pagers, data cards, pen drives, portable (external) hard disks, or any other electronic devices are strictly prohibited inside the Examination Hall. Possession of any such item will lead to expulsion from the examination. No arrangements shall be made at the examination centre for their safekeeping.
5. Failure to comply with these instructions will result in expulsion, cancellation of candidature, and/or appropriate legal action.
6. Candidates will not be permitted to leave the Examination Hall before completion of the entrance examination.
7. Candidates are advised to preserve their Hall Ticket carefully, as it shall be mandatory at the time of admission and counselling.
8. If a candidate is found indulging in unfair means during the examination, he/she will be debarred permanently from appearing in this examination in future.

### GUIDELINES FOR CORRECT OMR SHEET FILLING

1. The sheet should not be folded or crushed.
2. Use only blue ball point pen to fill the circles.
3. Use of pencil is strictly prohibited.
4. Circles should be darkened completely and properly (Refer image below).
5. Cutting and erasing on the OMR sheet is not allowed.
6. Do not use any stray marks on the sheet.
7. Do not use marker or white fluid to hide the mark.

### Duration to complete the course

- The course must be completed within a maximum period of one year.

### Stipend & leave eligibility

- A stipend of **INR 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only)** per month will be paid during the one-year study period of the course.
- A total of 04 week of leaves will be admissible for the entire duration of the one-year course.
- No stipend will be payable during any extension period, including extensions due to detention on account of ineligible internal assessment marks and/or attendance, medical reasons, or any other reason whatsoever.

### Discontinuation of the course

- If a candidate leaves the course after joining the post basic diploma in nursing, he/she shall be liable to pay a sum of Rs. 5,000/- as penalty to the institute.

### Break of study

- Break of study will not be permitted under any circumstances, including medical grounds. Students who leave the course mid-way may do so only by formally discontinuing the course, and their names will thereafter be removed from the rolls of the Institute. No correspondence in this regard will be entertained under

any circumstances.

### How to fill application form

1. Read the Prospectus and instructions carefully before filling the application form.
2. Candidates seeking admission to the Post Basic Diploma Courses in Nursing are required to apply online through the application link provided by AIIMS Bilaspur.
3. The Google Form/application link shall be uploaded on the official website of AIIMS Bilaspur (<https://www.aiimsbilaspur.edu.in>). Candidates are advised to regularly visit the website for updates regarding the application process.
4. Before filling the application form, candidates should ensure that they fulfill all eligibility criteria prescribed for the course.
5. Candidates must fill all required details carefully and upload the prescribed documents in the specified format.
6. Mode of payment of application fee shall be online through the payment link provided by the Institute.
7. After successful submission of the application form, candidates are advised to save and/or print a copy of the submitted application form and payment receipt for future reference.
8. Fees once paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
9. Requests for correction or modification of details submitted in the application form shall not be entertained after the last date of submission.
10. Incomplete applications, applications submitted after the due date, or applications containing false or misleading information shall be rejected.

### Force majeure

If entrance examination is postponed or cancelled (in part or in full) due to any reason whatsoever beyond control of organizers (viz. elements of nature, force majeure or orders/directives issued by any competent government authority), institute shall not be responsible for any loss or injury sustained by candidates directly or indirectly.

### Cancellation of Admission

Admission to the Post Basic Diploma Courses in Nursing shall be liable to cancellation at any stage if:

1. The candidate is found not to have fulfilled the prescribed eligibility criteria for admission.
2. Any information furnished by the candidate in the application form or during admission is found to be false, incorrect, misleading, or supported by fabricated/tampered documents.
3. The candidate is declared medically unfit by the Medical Board constituted by AIIMS Bilaspur, wherever applicable.
4. The candidate fails to complete the admission formalities, including payment of prescribed fees and joining the course within the stipulated period notified by the Institute.
5. The candidate violates any rules, regulations, or conditions prescribed by AIIMS Bilaspur for admission to the course.

In all such cases, the decision of AIIMS Bilaspur shall be final and binding, and no claim for refund of fees or restoration of admission shall be entertained.

### **Legal and disciplinary action**

**Legal and disciplinary action will be initiated by AIIMS, Bilaspur against persons who are found to be guilty of misconduct for reasons mentioned below (including but not limited to)**

- Obtaining support for his/her candidature by the following means, namely: —offering illegal gratification to; or applying pressure on; or blackmailing, or threatening to blackmail any person connected with the conduct of the examination; or
- Impersonation; or Procuring impersonation by any person; or
- Submitting fabricated documents or documents which have been tampered with; or
- Providing false information regarding educational qualifications and/or experience for the sole purpose of appearing in the examination for practice or any other purposes; or
- Uploading irrelevant photos in the application form in place of actual photo/signature/left thumb impression; or
- Uploading morphed/digitally modified photos for the purpose impersonation; or
- Making statements which are incorrect or false or suppressing material information; or
- Resorting to the following means in connection with ones candidature for the examination, namely: obtaining questions through improper means; finding out the particulars of the persons connected with secret work relating to the examination; influencing the personnel involved with conduct of examination.
- Being in possession of or using unfair means during the examination;
- Copying the questions, misbehaving in the examination hall including tearing of the scripts, provoking fellow examinees to boycott examination, creating a disorderly scene and the like; or
- Harassing or doing bodily harm to the staff deputed by Examination Section, Staff employed by Vendors for the purpose of conduct of examination.
- Being in possession of or using any mobile phone, (even in switched off mode), pager or any electronic equipment or programmable device or storage media like pen drive, smart watches etc. or camera or Bluetooth devices or any other equipment or related accessories either in working or switched off mode capable of being used as a communication device during the examination; or
- Violating any of the instructions issued to candidates along with their admission

certificates permitting them to take the examination; or

- Changing seats/question paper/any devices and changing computer screen/Mouse/keyboard without proper permission.
- Disputing terms of advertisement after participation in the examination.
- Attempting to commit or, as the case may be, abetting the commission of all or any of the acts specified in the foregoing clauses; may in addition to rendering himself liable to criminal prosecution, be liable: —
  - And shall be disqualified by the AIIMS, Bilaspur from this/or other Examinations for which he/she is a candidate; and/or
  - Shall be liable to be debarred either permanently or for a specified period: by the Examination Section, AIIMS, Bilaspur, from any examination or selection held by them; any other penalty as per discretion of competent authority.

### General Information

- Date, time and venue of examination will be provided on admit card.
- No TA/DA shall be paid for appearing in entrance examination or for joining.
- Number of seats/posts indicated in advertisement for various programs is provisional and subject to change without prior notice.
- There is no provision for re-checking/re-evaluation of answer sheets and no query in this regard will be entertained.
- Selected candidates must join course on stipulated date mentioned in letter of selection, failing which selection/admission shall stand cancelled/withdrawn.
- Each selected candidate shall have to pay fee/dues within prescribed period, failing which his/her admission/appointment shall be cancelled.
- Selected candidates shall need to have present original documents (medical registration, date of birth certificate, certificates of educational qualification, experience and relieving and good conduct certificate from University/Institution last attended) for inspection and verification by Institute authorities and submit a self-attested copy of each at time of joining.
- Training programs are full-time and continuous, and private practice in any form after joining Institute is strictly prohibited. Any violation of this may leave to termination of appointment and cancellation of admission.
- Candidates admitted to Institute shall maintain good conduct, attend their classes regularly and abide by regulations/guidelines of Institute failing which their names

are liable to be struck off rolls of Institute.

- Participation in any agitation, protest, strike, etc. is prohibited. Candidates not abiding with these provisions are liable to be terminated.
- Decisions taken by Executive Director of Institute in all matters related to selection of candidates for admission to various courses shall be final and no appeal shall be entertained on this subject.
- These rules are subject to change in accordance with decisions of Institute, taken from time to time.

### **Hostel Accommodation**

Hostel facility is limited at the institution therefore, it will not be possible to provide hostel accommodation to all. Candidates will have to make their own arrangements of stay. However, if hostel facilities are available institute may consider to allot the same.

### **Ragging**

Ragging is a cognizable offence and is strictly prohibited in the Institute. Stern disciplinary action shall be taken against any student found involved in ragging. Any person indulging in ragging shall be punished appropriately in accordance with the provisions of law and the rules of the Institute.

As per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, ragging in any form is completely banned within and outside the campus. AIIMS Bilaspur follows a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging and is committed to providing a safe and conducive learning environment for all students.

Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, instigates, or propagates ragging within or outside AIIMS Bilaspur shall be liable for strict disciplinary action. An FIR shall be lodged against the offender, and he/she may be suspended, rusticated, or expelled from the Institute, in addition to any other action as prescribed under the applicable laws and regulations.

All students and their parents/guardians are required to submit the Anti-Ragging Undertaking online at the time of admission through the National Anti-Ragging Portal. Submission of the online Anti-Ragging Undertaking is mandatory for completion of the admission process.

### **Gender Harassment**

A statutory committee, comprising of members from teaching and non-teaching staff

as well as students looks into matters related to sexual harassment of students and staff in college. Any person aggrieved in this matter may fearlessly approach committee for a fair and concerned hearing and redressal.

### **Eligibility for Scribe and/or compensatory time**

#### **1. The persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) defined under section 2(r) of the RPWD Act,2016.**

- A. Persons with Benchmark Disabilities in the categories of blindness, locomotor disability (both arms affected –BA)and cerebral palsy will be provided with the facility of a scribe if desired by the person against self-undertaking as per Appendix A Part A-1.
- B. The PwBD candidates in the category of blindness, locomotor disability (both arms affected-BA) and cerebral palsy are allowed Compensatory Time of twenty minutes per hour of the examination if desired by the person against self-undertaking as per Appendix A PartA-1.
- C. In the case of other categories of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities as defined under section 2(r) of the RPWD Act, 2016, the facility of scribe / Compensatory time will be allowed to such applicants on the production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitation in to write, and scribe is essential to write the examination on his behalf from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care institution as per the prescribed proforma (Appendix A).

#### **2. The persons with specified disabilities covered under the definition of section 2(s) of the RPWD Act, 2016 but not covered under the definition of section 2 (r) of the said Act, i.e. persons having less than 40% disability and having difficulty in writing.**

- A. In the case of those with less than Benchmark disabilities as defined under section 2(r) of the RPWD Act, 2016, the facility of scribe and or / Compensatory time shall be granted solely to those having difficulty in writing subject to the production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitation to write and that scribe is essential to write examination on his/her behalf from the competent medical authority of a Government Health Care institution as per prescribed Performa(Appendix A Both parts)

### **Appendix –II: Specified Disability Clause**

A SCHEDULE is annexed regarding, “SPECIFIED DISABILITY” clause (zc) of section 2,

that states as under,

1. Physical disability

A. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including— "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—

- i. loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
  - ii. manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
  - iii. extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
- a) "cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
  - b) "dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
  - c) "muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
  - d) "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual impairment—

- (a) "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—
  - (i) total absence of sight; or
  - (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with

best possible correction; or 92

(iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

(b) "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions-

(i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200

(Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or

(ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

C. Hearing impairment -

(a) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

(b) "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

D. "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

(a) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;

(b) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behaviour, — "mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by subnormality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to—

(a) chronic neurological conditions, such as— (i) "multiple sclerosis" means an

inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;

(ii) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

(b) Blood disorder—

(i) "haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;

(ii) "thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.

(iii) "sickle cell disease" means a haemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anaemia painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "haemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

5. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

6. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government.
